**The Evolve Solana ETF is considered an alternative mutual fund within the meaning of National Instrument 81-102 Investment Funds (“NI 81-102”) and is permitted to invest in asset classes or use investment strategies that are not permitted for other types of mutual funds. As an alternative mutual fund, under NI 81-102, the Evolve Solana ETF is permitted to use strategies generally prohibited by conventional mutual funds, including the ability to borrow cash to use for investment purposes and increased ability to invest in commodities. While these specific strategies will be used in accordance with the ETF’s investment objectives and strategies, during certain market conditions they may accelerate the pace at which your investment decreases in value.**

**The Evolve Solana ETF invests in Solana. Given the limited history and speculative nature of Solana and the volatility of the Solana markets, there is considerable risk that the Evolve Solana ETF will not be able to meet its investment objectives. An investment in the Evolve Solana ETF is not intended as a complete investment program and is appropriate only for investors who have a sophisticated knowledge and understanding of Solana and the capacity to absorb a loss of some or all of their investment. An investment in the Evolve Solana ETF is considered high risk.**

#### WHAT DOES THE ETF INVEST IN?

The ETF’s investment objective is to provide Unitholders with exposure to the daily price movements of the U.S. dollar price of Solana while experiencing minimal tracking error by utilizing the benefits of the creation and redemption processes offered by the exchange traded fund structure.

**HOW RISKY IS IT?**

The value of the ETF can go down as well as up. You could lose money. One way to gauge risk is to look at how much an ETF’s returns change over time. This is called “volatility”.

In general, ETFs with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. ETFs with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

**RISK RATING**

Evolve has rated the volatility of this ETF as **High**. Because this is a new ETF, the risk rating is only an estimate by Evolve. Generally, the rating is based on how much the ETF’s returns have changed from year to year. It doesn’t tell you how volatile the ETF will be in the future. The rating can change over time. An ETF with a low risk rating can still lose money.

**TRADING ETFs**

ETFs hold a basket of investments, like mutual funds, but trade on exchanges like stocks. Here are a few things to keep in mind when trading ETFs:

**Pricing**

ETFs have two sets of prices: market price and NAV.

**Market Price**

ETFs are bought and sold on exchanges at the market price. The market price can change throughout the trading day. Factors like supply, demand, and changes in the value of an ETF’s investments can affect the market price.

You can get price quotes any time during the trading day. Quotes have two parts: bid and ask.

The bid is the highest price a buyer is willing to pay if you want to sell your ETF units. The ask is the lowest price a seller is willing to accept if you want to buy ETF units. The difference between the two is call the “bid-ask spread”.

**Net Asset Value (NAV)**

Like mutual funds, ETFs have a NAV. It is calculated after the close of each trading day and reflects the value of an ETF’s investment at that point in time.

NAV is used to calculate financial information for reporting purposes – like the returns shown in this document.

**Orders**

There are two main options for placing trades: market orders and limit orders. A market order lets you buy or sell units at the current market price. A limit order lets you set the price at which you are willing to buy or sell units.

**Timing**

In general, a smaller bid-ask spread means the ETF is more liquid. That means you are more likely to get the price you expect.

In general, market prices of ETFs can be more volatile around the start and end of the trading day. Consider using a limit order or placing a trade at another time during the trading day.

### WHO IS THIS ETF FOR?

Investors:

- seeking exposure to the daily price movements of the U.S. dollar price of Solana;
- seeking a convenient, secure alternative to a direct investment in Solana;
- who have a sophisticated knowledge and understanding of Solana; and
- who have the capacity to absorb a loss of some or all of their investment.

### A WORD ABOUT TAX

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on an ETF. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the ETF in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your ETF in a non-registered account, distributions from the ETF are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

### HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

This section shows the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell CAD Units of the ETF. Fees and expenses – including trailing commissions – can vary among ETFs. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other ETFs and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. BROKERAGE COMMISSIONS	You may have to pay a commission every time you buy and sell CAD Units of the ETF. Commissions may vary by brokerage firm. Some brokerage firms may offer commission-free ETFs or require a minimum purchase amount.
2. ETF EXPENSES	You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the ETF's returns. The ETF's expenses are made up of the management fee, operating expenses and trading costs. The ETF's annual management fee is 1.00% of the ETF's value. As this ETF is new, operating expenses and trading costs are not yet available.
3. STAKING SERVICE FEE	<p>The ETF may stake Solana held in its portfolio in order to earn rewards for the ETF, which rewards will, following the deduction of applicable fees (including the Staking Service Fee) and expenses, accrue to the ETF's net asset value for the benefit of the ETF's unitholders.</p> <p>The Manager is entitled to receive a portion of the staking rewards generated for the Fund by the staking of Solana held in the Fund, such that no less than 65% of the rewards accrue to the Fund and up to 35% of the rewards accrue to the Manager.</p>
4. TRAILING COMMISSION	The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the ETF. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide you. This ETF doesn't have a trailing commission.

### OTHER FEES

Other charges	An amount may be charged to offset certain transaction costs associated with an issue, exchange or redemption of the units. This charge does not apply to unitholders who buy and sell their units through the facilities of the Toronto Stock Exchange.

### WHAT IF I CHANGE MY MIND?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase. In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the prospectus, ETF Facts or financial statement contains a misrepresentation.
