Interim Management Report of Fund Performance

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Investment Objective and Strategies

The Evolve Enhanced Yield Mid Term Bond Fund (the "Fund") seeks to provide Unitholders with attractive monthly income and long-term capital appreciation by targeting a medium duration fixed income portfolio by investing primarily in fixed income ETFs or fixed income securities issued in either the United States or Canada. To enhance yield, as well as to mitigate risk and reduce volatility, the Fund will employ a covered call option writing program at the discretion of the Manager. The level of covered call option writing may vary based on market volatility and other factors.

Risk

There were no changes to the Fund over the period of this report that materially affected the level of risk associated with an investment in the Fund. Prospective investors should read the Fund's most recent prospectus and consider the description of risks contained therein.

Results of Operations

Since the Hedged, Unhedged and US Dollar Unhedged ETF Units of the Fund effectively began operations on March 27, 2025, and the Hedged Class A and F Mutual Fund Units of the Fund effectively began operations on April 9, 2025, no performance data can be shown. The Fund's net assets were \$26.3MM as at June 30, 2025.

For the six-month period ended June 30, 2025, the Fund generated an increase (decrease) in net assets attributable to holders of redeemable units from operations of \$196,409. The Fund distributed \$433,351 to unitholders during the period. The decision to make distributions exceeding earnings was made by Evolve Funds Group Inc. (the "Manager"), due to the following factors:

The Funds' Declaration of Trust requires that sufficient amounts be paid or made payable each year so that the Funds are not liable for any non-refundable income tax under Part I of the Tax Act.

Amounts included in the calculation of the Fund's net income and net realized capital gains for a taxation year may encompass amounts that have not yet been received by the Fund.

The Manager believes that maintaining regular and stable distributions is vital to meet unitholder expectations and retain investor confidence. Consequently, distribution rates are only adjusted in response to material changes.

The Manager believes that a full business cycle is required for a comprehensive evaluation of results.

The Manager holds a strong conviction in the Fund's investment objective and its future growth prospects.

Portfolio Manager Commentary

Mid-duration U.S. Treasuries delivered strong performance in the first half of 2025, supported by evolving macroeconomic conditions, shifting interest rate expectations, and a broad rotation out of long-duration exposure. The year opened with steady demand for intermediate bonds, buoyed by moderating inflation and growing speculation around a potential Federal Reserve pivot. However, this narrative shifted abruptly in April following major policy announcement from the White House.

On April 2nd—Liberation Day—President Trump announced sweeping "reciprocal tariffs" on U.S. imports. The news triggered a broad selloff across the yield curve¹. The 10-year Treasury repriced sharply as investors reassessed inflation risks and fiscal sustainability.

In May, Moody's downgraded the U.S. credit rating by one notch due to rising debt levels. While the move had limited market impact—following earlier downgrades by S&P (2011) and Fitch (2023)—it ended Moody's AAA rating held since 1917 and reinforced deficit concerns². These were amplified by the reintroduction of Trump's tax bill, seen as likely to widen the fiscal gap and elevate national debt³.

By June, sentiment improved as inflation came in below expectations for a fourth consecutive month⁴. This boosted market confidence in a sustained disinflation trend and raised the likelihood of Fed easing. While the Fed held rates steady through the first half of 2025, its updated dot plot continued to show two potential cuts by year-end, contingent on economic developments and the impact of tariffs⁵.

A structural tailwind for intermediate Treasuries came with the Senate's passage of the GENIUS Stablecoin Act, which sets a regulatory framework for USD-backed stablecoins⁶. As adoption grows, stablecoin issuers are expected to hold Treasuries—especially in the short to mid-term range—as reserves, potentially driving sustained demand and downward pressure on yields.

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Overall, mid-term U.S. Treasuries delivered strong performance in the first half of the year. While April's policy shocks weighed on markets, improving inflation data and the potential for increased institutional demand helped restore stability. The intermediate part of the curve remains a focal point for investors balancing rate sensitivity with yield in an uncertain macro and fiscal landscape.

Recent Developments

In 2025, trade tensions have escalated as the United States considers imposing new tariffs on key trading partners, including Canada and Mexico, along with broader reciprocal measures on other nations. In response, affected countries may enact retaliatory tariffs, further increasing uncertainty in global trade. These developments have contributed to heightened market volatility and could disrupt global supply chains, particularly impacting trade-sensitive sectors. The duration and full impact of these events remain uncertain, and as such, the financial implications for investments cannot be estimated at this time.

Related Party Transactions

The Manager, a corporation incorporated under the laws of the Province of Ontario, is the trustee, manager, and portfolio advisor of the Fund and is responsible for the day-to-day administration of the Fund. The Fund pays annual management fees to the Manager as consideration for its services. Any management fees paid to the Manager are related party transactions, as the Manager is considered to be a related party to the Fund. The management fees are disclosed in the statements of comprehensive income in the annual financial statements of the Fund and are discussed in greater detail below.

The Fund is permitted to purchase, sell and hold securities of certain issuers that are directly or indirectly related to the Manager. With respect to investment in related issuers, the Manager has relied on the approval that it has received from the Investment Review Committee ("IRC"). The Manager complies with its current policy and procedures regarding investments in related issuers and reports periodically to the IRC.

Management Fees

The Manager is entitled to an annual management fee of 0.45% of the net asset value of the Hedged, Unhedged, and US Dollar Unhedged ETF Units and the Hedged Class F Mutual Fund Units of the Fund, accrued daily and generally paid monthly in arrears. The Manager is entitled to an annual management fee of 1.20% of the net asset value of the Hedged Class A Mutual Fund Units of the Fund, accrued daily and generally paid monthly in arrears. For the six-month period ended June 30, 2025, the Fund incurred \$2,464 in management fees. These management fees were received by the Manager for the day-to-day operations of the fund, including managing the portfolio, maintaining portfolio systems used to manage the Fund, maintaining the www.evolveetfs.com website, and providing all other services including marketing and promotion.

Administration Fees

The administration fees are calculated based on 0.15% per annum of the average daily net asset value of the Fund. The fees are accrued daily and are generally paid monthly. For the six-month period ended June 30, 2025, the Fund incurred \$5,485 in administration fees. These administration fees were received by the Manager for the following operating expenses of the Fund including but not limited to: mailing and printing expenses for periodic reports to unitholders; Registrar and Transfer Agent and Custodian; any reasonable out of pocket expenses incurred by the Manager or its agents in connection with their ongoing obligations to the Fund; IRC committee member fees and expenses in connection with the IRC; expenses related to compliance with NI 81-107; fees and expenses relating to voting of proxies by a third party; insurance coverage for the members of the IRC; fees payable to the auditors and legal advisors of the Fund; regulatory filing, stock exchange and licensing fees and CDS fees; costs and expenses of complying with all applicable laws, regulations and policies, including expenses and costs incurred in connection with the continuous public filing requirements such as permitted prospectus preparation and filing expenses; and legal, accounting and audit fees and fees and expenses of the Trustee, Custodian and Manager which are incurred in respect of matters not in the normal course of the Fund's activities. The administration fee paid to the Manager by the Fund may, in any particular period, be less than or exceed the operating expenses that the Manager incurs for the Fund.
